BBQ TICKET SALES

As implementation of the annual 4-H BBQ takes place, you can help the Leaders' Council checking account from experiencing a drain by turning in your BBQ moneys as you have it available.

It is recommended that each club take the opportunity to turn in their money at the following dates:

October 4th: Leaders Council Meeting October 18th: Livestock Leaders' Meeting

October 21st: 4-H BBQ

The final deadline to turn in BBQ and money will be November 1st, 2012, by the end of the Leaders' Council Meeting on that date. On any money turned in after this date, your club will receive no profit.

For example: Mid-Valley 4-H club has 500 tickets. On October 18^{th} , they turn in \$2,000.00 (for 250 tickets). After the deadline, they turn in \$1600 and 50 tickets. The council votes to give each club 20% of the profits. Because Mid-valley 4-H club only turned in \$2,000.00 before the deadline, they will only receive \$400 (2,000 x 20%). If they had turned in everything by the deadline, they would have received \$720.00 (3,500 x 20%).

TEEN INVOLVEMENT CONFERENCE (TIC) WORKSHOPS NEEDED!!

The 2013 Teen Involvement Conference is looking for educational workshops to offer for the conference delegates. The conference will be held the third weekend of January from the 18th to 20th. Teen Involvement Conference (TIC) is held at Pathfinder Ranch in Mountain Center, Riverside County, California. The conference is for 4-H youth ages 13-19. The goal of the conference is to teach the delegates new skills in teamwork, leadership, citizenship, along with State wide 4-H opportunities.

Required for 4-H Adult Volunteers:

4-H Youth Development volunteer applications are reviewed and appointed annually by the County Director. Adult applicants must complete the following once for as long as they are continuously enrolled. If there is a gap in enrollment, these steps must be repeated.

Department of Justice (DOJ) Clearance

To interact with 4-H youth, adults must be cleared by the Department of Justice. You may already have such clearance with another organization - however, to protect your privacy, this information cannot be shared between organizations, and you must repeat this process to receive clearance with the 4-H Youth Development Program.

- 5. Follow up to be sure exhibitors submitted DNA collection (see deadlines below)
- 6. All livestock must be entered on an official fair entry form by January 25, 2013; and appropriate fees paid and submitted to entry office for entry to be validated

Exhibitors must pre-register and DNA/tag all Market Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goats and Feeder Calves. Leaders and advisors must use the official Pre-Registration Log that is available online or at the Fair office; all other forms will not be accepted. While Leaders and Advisors can assist, exhibitors are ultimately responsible for collecting DNA and completing all paperwork. All forms available online www.ivexpo.com.
