## Required for 4-H Adult Volunteers:

4-H Youth Development volunteer applications are reviewed and appointed annually by the County Director. Adult applicants must complete the following once for as long as they are continuously enrolled. If there is a gap in enrollment, these steps must be repeated.

#### \*\*Department of Justice (DOJ) Clearance\*\*

To interact with 4-H youth, adults must be cleared by the Department of Justice. You may already have such clearance with another organization - however, to protect your privacy, this information cannot be shared between organizations, and you must repeat this process to receive clearance with the 4-H Youth Development Program.

To complete this process, you will need to make an appointment with the Imperial County Sheriff's Department. To get started, contact the 4-H Office:

Each new leader must go through a one-time orientation to learn the values, best practices, and policies that should be adhered to when working with 4-H youth.

## CALIFORNIA MID-WINTER FAIR & FIESTA "NO GO-NO SHOW" CODE OF CONDUCT TRAINING

This training is mandatory for all first time Livestock Animal Exhibitors (Primary Members are exempt). For returning exhibitors, this training will be required once every three years – If you took the training for the 2012 Fair, you will not need to take the training again until prior to the 2015 Fair.

There are two training sessions scheduled at the IV Expo (Building TBA):

Wednesday, January 9, 2013

JUNIORS - 6pm-7pm

SENIORS - 7pm-8pm

Saturday, January 12, 2013

JUNIORS – 10am–11am

SENIORS - 11am-12pm

#### Rules:

\*If this is your first time competing at the California Mid-Winter Fair, and you do not attend an Ethics Training, you will not be able to show at the Fair. No Exceptions.

\*Showmen who were primary members last year, and regular members for the first time this year will be treated as new members and required to attend this year's training.

\*Juniors will not be allowed to attend the Seniors' training, and Seniors will not be allowed to attend the Juniors' training.

\*During the training, members will be expected to be quiet and respectful. Disruptive behavior may result in being asked to leave, then both attend and assist with the next training.

#### TEEN INVOLVEMENT CONFERENCE (TIC) 1


The California 4-H South Section Teen Involvement


