RECORD BOOKS

Completing a Record Book

4-H members wishing to compete for county awards must submit their completed record book to their 4-H community leader by the date, place, and time as set by their club rule. This year please only select your top two categories for judging.

Club Level Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of the community club leader to make sure that all record books are checked for missing signatures, that required forms are placed in proper order, that no forms are missing and that the book is eligible to be judged at county level.

Club Level Judging

Before a book can be judged at county level it must first be judged at club level. Your club record book committee has first responsibility on eligibility.

County Level Judging

This year record books will be judged on Saturday, June 5, 2004, at the 4-H Office, 1050 E. Holton Road in Holtville. Check-in time is from 7:30a.m. to 9:30a.m. Judging will start at 10:00a.m. and conclude when all books have been judged. The date set for judging of record books was accepted by and voted on by our 4-H Leader's Council.

Acceptance of Books

All eligible books will be accepted for judging to receive county level awards if received by the time deadline set by the record book committee (9:00a.m.). Late books will not be accepted. Any member of the club's record book judging committee may submit a club member's record book for judging with community leader approval.

Judging

All judging done at county level will be done at the 4-H Extension Office. As soon as judging is complete all books must be removed from the office as space is limited.





Record Book Content Order

All record books should be submitted in the following order:

*Hard Green or Green Paper Covers

*4-H Member Award Application

*I.C. 4-H Achievement Award application properly filled out and signed by club leaders.

*Table of Contents must be placed directly before the California 4-H Personal Development Report Form.

*California 4-H Personal Development Report Form, with required signatures at the bottom of page 1, for the current project year.

*Annual 4-H Project Report Form for each project completed during the current project year. Records for the project category the member is entering their Record Book in must be immediately following the California 4-H Personal Development Report Form.

*Supplemental/Advanced/Additional Records, if included, must be behind the Annual Project Report Form for the project

they represent, i.e., Feed Efficiency, Clothing, etc. (No more than five forms).

Junior/Teen Leader Report and Chairman's Report Form must be included behind the project it represents.

Photo Pages, three single pages, one side only.

The community club leaders are to review the record books and sign where indicated (Award Application Forms and Personal Development Form). Project leaders should sign the Annual Project Report Form and Supplemental forms where required.



Record books submitted without <u>ALL</u> signatures will not be eligible for awards. Member needs to check their book to make sure the signatures are there. Some forms require signatures in more than one place. Only submit project work in your Record Book that is complete and has the proper signatures.

AWARD APPLICATION INCLUDES:

- ✓ County Awards
- ✓ Novice Record Book (First Year Member)
- ✓ Imperial County 4-H Achievement (Special Application)
- ✓ Novice books will contain all of the above. The same order and requirements apply.

Starting this year, New Council Award changes are now available. They are:

- 4-H Leader's Council Family Consumer Science Achievement Award – can be won once as a Junior and once as a Senior.
- 4-H Leader's Council Leisure Arts Achievement Award – can be won as a Junior and once as a Senior.

When done by a 4-H member, the record book may be submitted in type written form using a computer or typewritten form using a computer or typewriter for 4-H members starting in the 7th grade or 12 years of age if home schooled. It is preferred that 4th to 6th grade books be done in pen or pencil. Most 4-H forms can be found on the 4-H website at: www.fourh.ucdavis.edu or by contacting your community leader.



Additional Book Guidelines and Tips:

Self-Determined Projects

Projects done under this category are only for areas of interest not listed on the backside of the enrollment card. Members should check with community club leaders before enrolling in this project.

Dance Recital

A dance recital will no longer be considered a tangible item. Cultural Arts project members may enter educational posters as exhibits for the Fair window displays, etc.

Umbrella Projects

Umbrella Projects consist of the following projects:

 Achievements (Accomplishments and attainments of goals in all 4-H projects) and Agriculture (to include Animal, Plant Science, and Ag. Mechanics).

Home Arts & Furnishings

The project completes in the Home Environment area as listed in the 4-H Incentives and Awards Handbook. Members must enroll in the project in which they submit a record book no later than June.

Club Books

Individual officers can compete for awards based on their Secretary's, Treasurer's, Reporters, and Historian books. Officers designated as winners will receive a medal at Achievement Night. Officer books are due at the same time as member record books.

*Note: There is a new Treasurer's Book, please follow instructions <u>carefully</u>.

Club Seals

Each club is eligible for a seal to be affixed to the charter awarded to their club when it was formed. The color for the seal indicates the number of goals club has achieved, based on the form, "Suggested Objectives For 4-H Seals."

21 – Plus - Gold Seal

17 – 20 - Blue Seal

12 – 16 - Green Seal

The Secretary's Book and the form "Suggested Objectives For 4-H Seals" should be submitted in a three (3) ring binder together with an award application.

All eligible youth, graduating eight graders and high school youth are urged to attend this conference. 
